CERT Training

Have you ever felt as if there was something you could do to help during an emergency? Have you ever wondered if you would be able to help your family in an emergency? Well there is!

Fulton County Fire Department has teamed up with GEMA and Atlanta Fulton County EMA to offer CERT training. CERT stands for Community Emergency Response Team. CERT training promotes a partnering effort between Fulton County Fire Department and the people they serve. The goal is for FCFD personnel to train members of neighborhoods, community organizations, etc in basic response needs.

If a disastrous event overwhelms or delays the community's professional response, CERT members can assist others by applying the basic response and organizational skills that they have learned during training. These skills can help save and sustain lives following a disaster until help arrives. CERT skills also apply to daily emergencies.

CERT Training is designed to cover: 1. Disaster Preparedness for Storms, Flooding, Blizzards, Earthquakes, Terrorists Attacks, etc. 2. Fire Safety 3. Disaster Medical Operations - Triage and Treating Life Threatening Injuries 4. Disaster Medical Operations - Assessment, Treatment, and Hygiene 5. Light Search and Rescue 6. Team Organization and Disaster Psychology 7. Terrorism 8. Final Exercise.

The completed course is a minimum of 20 hours. Each class session requires 2-3 hours to complete.

I am organizing a class made up of Glastonberry neighbors and high school students. ANYONE over the age of 14 to eligible to attend. The classes will be held at the Medlock Bridge Fire Station (across from St. Ives) on Saturday or Sundays in 4 hours blocks of time. Lt. Harris (FCFD) is suggesting we meet every other week for the course.

Hours of Operation: May 26 – Last day of School 3:30 – 9 – Parties begin at 3:30

May 27 – August 13 11 – 8 Monday, Tuesday 11 – 9 Wednesday, Thursday, Saturday 11 – 10 Friday 12 – 8 Sunday

August 14 – September 4 4:30 – 6:30 Monday – Thursday 4:30 – 9:00 Friday 11 – 9 Saturday 12 – 8 Sunday

DON'T FORGET - when there is a regular home meet the POOL WILL BE CLOSED! When the schedule comes out we will post these dates.

Other Reminders:

- NO GLASS - this means: Coffee mugs, bottles of ANY KIND, casserole dishes or bowls when there is party - anything that can break - don't bring it.
- SWIM DIAPERS ONLY - if your child is in a diaper at any part of the day then a swim diaper is mandatory. If your child is training or just trained a swim diaper is mandatory. If a child has an accident in the pool the pool is closed for 24 hours. Parents: make sure to take your child to the bathroom EVERY break. Do

not wait for them to tell you they have to go. The pool is a bigger / easier for them to use.

- DO NOT CHANGE DIAPERS ON THE TABLES - this should be obvious since we use those tables to eat but this is just a reminder.
- NO GLASS - this means: Coffee mugs, bottles of ANY KIND, casserole dishes or bowls when there is party - anything that can break - don't bring it.

Note from the Pool Chair:

If there is trash on the ground (even if it's not yours) please pick it up. Please stress this with your children.

If you see that the tables need cleaning after you use them - clean them. Don't leave juice and food behind.

Colorectal Cancer

Colorectal cancer (commonly known as colon cancer) is the third leading cause of cancer death in men and women. If anyone in your family is 50 or older, they need to be screened for colorectal cancer. Individuals with a family history of colorectal cancer need to get screened earlier.

While those who have cancer in their family histories are at an increased risk, the majority of colon cancer cases occur in people whose only risk factor is their age. That means everyone - men and women - should be screened. Many people think that testing should only happen when symptoms arise. However, symptoms are often a sign that the disease has progressed into more advanced stages.

Colon cancer screening tests can find and remove polyps before they develop into cancer, preventing the disease from occurring. And, even if colon cancer is evident, when caught early enough, there is a 90 percent survival rate. Unfortunately, only 38 percent of colon cancers are detected at that stage. And, screening rates for colorectal cancer are alarmingly low in the U.S. with less than 50% of people over the age of 50 getting screened.

Bottom line – ask your doctor about colorectal cancer screening when you reach the age of 50 or if you have a family history – it could save your life.
